The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), a division of the United States Department of Labor, uses employment data to forecast changes in occupations in the coming years. Students choosing a path based on career outlook data have a greater assurance of finding employment and fair wages in the next ten years.

Is the region hiring for this job?

Is the region expecting a future need?

Does the job pay fair wages?

What are the education requirements?



If you draw well, enjoy detailed work, and have a good visual eye, then take a look at drafting. Drafters prepare technical drawings used by production and construction workers for building.

Average Wages: \$27/hour

Education Level: Associate's Degree (2 Years)



The field is very diverse with positions ranging from technicians to senior vice presidents with salaries ranging from the \$20K to \$100K.

Average Wages: \$33/hour

Education Level: Certificate/Associate's Degree (2 Years)



Electricians install wiring systems, rewire or upgrade existing electrical systems and work at construction sites, in homes and in businesses or factories, schools and government buildings.

Average Wages: \$27/hour Education Level: Certificate



Heating, A/C and refrigeration (HART) technicians install, maintain and repair climate-control and refrigeration systems. They work in homes, buildings, hospitals, schools, office spaces and factories.

Average Wages: \$23/hour Education Level: Certificate



If you enjoy power tools, precision work, and value pride in your job, you may consider pipefitting as a career. Pipefitters fabricate, install and repair piping or tubing systems that convey liquid, gas and occasionally solid materials.

Average Wages: \$26/hour Education Level: Certificate



WELDERS, CUTTERS & SOLDERERS

Welders have a passion for artistry, perfection, and technique. They melt and fuse metal using heat or pressure so that the metal structure is strong enough to support the building.

Average Wages: \$25/hour

Education Level: Associate's Degree (2 Years)



PRE-K THROUGH 12TH EDUCATORS

Average Wages: \$28/hour

Education Level: Bachelor's degree (4 Years)



LICENSED NURSES (LP & LVN)

Licensed Vocational nurses provide basic bedside care to the patients, as directed by the physicians or registered nurses. LVNs work in hospitals, physicians' offices, nursing homes and more.

Average Wages: \$22/hour Education Level: Certificate



REGISTERED NURSES (RN)

Registered nurses monitor, record and report symptoms or changes in patients' conditions, administer medication and treatment to patients and observing reactions or side effects.

Average Wages: \$35/hour

Education Level: Associate's Degree (2 Years)



Organize and manage health information in both paper and electronic files. Code and categorize patient information for insurance reimbursement purposes, registries, and patient histories.

Average Wages: \$19/hour

Education Level: Associate's Degree (2 Years)



CHEMICAL PLANT OPERATORS

Chemical plant operators oversee the personnel and equipment necessary to run a successful chemical manufacturing operation. Their goal is to improve plant quality, efficiency and safety.

Average Wages: \$35/hour Education Level: Certificate



MILLWRIGHT & INDUSTRIAL MECHANICS

A millwright or industrial mechanic maintains and installs machinery and heavy equipment. They typically work in machine shops, manufacturing facilities and at construction sites.

Average Wages: \$25/hour Education Level: Certificate



MACHINE FEEDERS & MACHINISTS

If you love to design, create, and collaborate, then take a look at machine technology. A machinist uses high-tech tools, equipment, and computer sofware to craft custom metal parts.

Average Wages: \$24/hour Education Level: Certificate



INSTRUMENT TECHNICIANS

Instrument technicians work with instruments to monitor flow, level, pressure, temperature and chemical composition.

Average Wages: \$24/hour
